1.4.2 How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

Feedback is obtained from all major stakeholders of the college namely students, parents, alumnae, academic peers, industry experts and potential employers.

There is a structured feedback form and a formal mechanism for collecting feedback from students, parents and alumna. Student give feedback on the course and teacher conducting the course at the end of every semester. This feedback is collected online for every student and every course. The data is collated and presented to the Department and faculty for discussion, corrective action/improvements if required. A copy of the feedback for every semester is also kept at the Library. Student representatives on the Boards of studies of Departments and the academic council also collect and present feedback from their peers. Changes in curriculum, introduction of new courses value added courses and internships have been made based on feedback from students.

Feedback on the college is obtained from all parents during open day in January every year. This data is compiled analysed and presented to the Departments and management for action where necessary. Feedback on the curriculum was collected from ten percent of parents representing all students for the first time in January this year. This was compiled analysed and presented to the Departments and Management. Strategies to enhance employability skills and campus recruitments are being considered as a basis of this

feedback.

Feedback is collected online in a structured format from alumna who come for graduation day. This feedback, as well as feedback from alumna on the Department boards of studies and alumnae returning to college is compiled and used for planning curriculum and internships. Several need based courses, add on certificate courses, internships etc. have been introduced based on feedback from alumna.

Academic peers who are representatives on the boards of studies, academic audit panel and examiners and subject experts have given valuable feedback that has resulted in positive changes in the curriculum and evaluation pattern. Some Departments have had their curriculum whetted by subject experts in reputed universities and used this feedback during revision of curriculum.

Industry experts on the boards of studies, IQAC committee, management board and academic council give valuable inputs and suggestions that have resulted in introduction of new courses, internships and soft skill training for employability. Potential employers coming for campus recruitments have also provided valuable inputs that have led to offering value addition through online certification courses and training in soft skills and interview skill through the career guidance cell.

The feedback taken from students and other stakeholders is presented at the Governing Body and is also given to the departments. Based on the inputs new courses are introduced and measures are taken to rectify problems if any. Remedial Coaching and Advanced courses for different types of learners are introduced. New teaching learning methods are implemented and evaluation patterns are constantly revised. Value added courses and skill development is focussed upon to make students employable.

The advisor advisee system is a unique practice of the college that has been successfully practiced for several decades wherein every student is assigned a faculty mentor to facilitate her personal growth and academic progress. A faculty mentor is assigned 15 to 25 students to provide support and advice and monitor the progress of the student, facilitating her holistic development. Faculty mentors monitor the academic performance of students and offer suggestions for improvement. They also record regularity of students, their participation in curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, disciplinary issues if any and also recommend students for management scholarships, leadership roles, representation in committees etc.

This practice has received positive feedback from past students who felt faculty mentoring helped students utilise the facilities and programs on campus better and also facilitated holistic development.

There is a mechanism for redressal of student grievances. The student has the right to appeal on grievances pertaining to academics and marks. She will first appeal to the course teachers soon after receiving the valued paper if the grievance is regarding Continuous Internal assessment. If additional clarification is required the student will appeal to the Head of the Department. If unsatisfied she may make a written appeal to the Principal within 24 hours of receiving the marks. Issues relating to end semester marks are represented to the controller of examinations in writing.

Ragging is prohibited and any incident of ragging may be reported to the principal through email or a written complaint dropped in a black box kept at the Principal's office. This is then taken up for redressal through the Ragging redressal committee set up as per statutory norm and comprising of the Principal, vice principal, Dean of Shift II, Deans of Student services and Residents, Chairperson of residents, hostel wardens, University registrar and local police Inspector.

Other grievances including complaints of bullying, harassment, sexual harassment etc. of students,

faculty and non-teaching staff are taken up by the internal complaints committee comprising of the Dean of Centre for Women's studies, four senior faculty and a legal advisor. Complaints are to be recorded in writing within seven days of the harassment incident and the committee conducts an enquiry and presents a report for action.

Students are oriented to the grievance redressal mechanism through the college handbook, during orientation, announcements on the PA system and during assembly programs. Orientation on the mechanism is also communicated to faculty and non-teaching staff.

The College promotes decentralization and participative management that develop second level leadership while also making the management process simpler, quicker and more transparent. This year three new administrative leadership roles were initiated. A centre for environmental studies was inaugurated and the post of Dean was created to spearhead sustainability and green initiatives on campus .The Dean works in collaboration with the faculty and student coordinators of the Eco club in planning and implementing various programs that reflect the College’s commitment to environmental sustainability. The Dean, Centre for Environmental studies also coordinates with the Deans of student services and the IQAC coordinator in implementing the environmental policy of the college and in conducting the environment audit. The Leadership roles of Dean, Centre for Women’s Studies and Coordinator of International programs introduced this year is another example of decentralization. The Dean, Centre for Women’s studies has the task of organizing gender sensitization programs for the college community, conduct awareness programs on sexual harassment and set up and chair the Harassment complaints committee in addition to the regular functions of encouraging research and sharing of research findings to empower women in the community. The role of Coordinator of International programs was created to facilitate the student exchange, semester abroad and twinning programs with various foreign universities.

The College promotes participative management in almost all areas of its functioning. The biggest strength of the college is the involvement of the management, faculty, non-teaching staff, students and even members of the alumnae in committees that organize major events of the College like the college play, the alumnae food fair, convocation etc. For each of these events, several committees are set up with faculty, student and non-teaching staff working together, taking collective decisions, planning and implementing action plans for the successful conduct of these events.

Program specific outcome and program outcomes were developed to enable implementation of outcome based education. In 2017-18, 724 students took up NPTEL courses for value addition, skill development and employability and 20 students received certification after opting to take the exam. 244 students of Computer Science, Home Science and Psychology

underwent the spoken tutorial course offered by IIT Mumbai under MOOC and all received certification. Learner designed courses and service learning courses for additional credit were offered .Nine add on certificate courses and one three level certificate course leading to a diploma in Financial & Capital Market were offered this year

❖ **Teaching and Learning**

The academic audit by external experts was conducted on 27th February 2018. Three Conferences (1 International & 2 National), one symposium, three seminars (1 National & 2 regional) four Endowment lectures, one Endowment workshop, six workshops ,five Faculty Development Programs/workshops were organised

Students and faculty benefitted from lectures from visiting scholars and eminent academics from India and abroad, including an English professor from Ginling University, China under the scholar in residence program.

❖ **Research and Development**

The Student seed grant of Rs.100,000 awarded to 31 UG and PG students, the newly introduced faculty seed grant and the release of the second edition of the WCC Research journal (a blind ,per reviewed journal with ISDN gave impetus to research and publications this year. Around 99 Research Papers were published in refereed International and National Journals.

The code of ethics in research was designed to foster and uphold high standards of scientific integrity and social responsibility and a board was set up for monitoring the code of ethics in research at WCC will monitor ethical practices in research and publication, Misrepresentation of data, Misconduct in academic research and safeguarding intellectual property rights for research undertaken in WCC.

Policy on Consultancy and Resource Sharing was also developed.

The Departments of Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science, PBPB, AZBT & Home Science participated in Rashtriya Avishkar Abhiyan- a program for mentoring children from government schools in the neighbourhood. The Department of Physics, conducted training in experimental physics for school teachers and students on August 11th 2017 with funds from the DBT Star College Scheme)

A workshop for school French teachers (Dept of Languages and French Embassy and IATF) was organized by the Department of languages. Training for English Teachers of government schools was organized on July 2017 by the English Department, Shift I under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Scheme.

Training in basic computer skills was offered to 92 teachers by the Computer science Department (Shift I) on November 28th & 29th and for 198 school teachers on December 7th &

8th by CST Department and training of 110 school teachers on December 12th & 13th 2018 by the IT Department (Shift II) also under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan and Rashtriya Avishkar Abhiyan schemes.

❖ **Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation**

The library introduced RFID tags, an integrated barcode for document transactions, 12 more surveillance cameras and 5 Pc's. More LCD projectors have been installed. The canteen and offices of the Principal and Controller of Examinations were renovated. Steam kitchen, solar panels and RO plant were installed to benefit resident students. Hostels were renovated and more television sets, geysers, microwave oven were provided. A new gallery and Lily Pond were constructed in the Main Hostel square and the main common room was refurbished. A First Aid Room was set up. ELS Book Shop was started to meet the stationery needs of students. More stone benches were constructed to provide students places to rest and relax.

❖ **Human Resource Management**

Faculty, student senate and non-teaching staff retreat, orientation program for new faculty, FDPs on research, intellectual property rights, student centric teaching methodologies were some HRD initiatives for faculty while administrative and support staff had development programs on time and stress management and effective communication and segregation of wastes respectively.

Faculty are given additional administrative responsibilities to hone leadership skills and encouraged to update knowledge and skills through attending workshops, conferences and seminars. Students are given opportunities to develop leadership potential, planning and organizing skills through the various leadership roles in the student senate, clubs and extension activity clubs. One student, attended a Leadership Program in South Korea and two faculty attended the Advanced Leadership training program at Haggai Institute, Hawaii.

❖ **Industry Interaction / Collaboration**

MoUs for collaboration were signed by the college with Apollo Shine Foundation to provide a First aid room on campus with two trained nurses, Holy Cross College, Agartala, West Tripura, Ginling College, China, LeTourneau University, Texas, USA and INaWord, Chennai. MoU was renewed with Concordia College, New York, USA for an American Transfer Program and for Certificate Courses.

Departments signed MoUs with organisations, NGOs, laboratories, academic and professional institutions like Karadi Path Education Company, Prajnya, Madras Players, Tamil Nadu Science and Technology Centre, Care Earth Trust, C P Ramasami Environment Education Centre, Pithavadian and Partners, Synthia Research Laboratory Pvt Limited, Pondicherry, Association of Chartered Certified Accountant (ACCA), London, ANSA India Pvt. Ltd., Chennai. and Stone Bench Creations (Film Production Company)

❖ **Admission of Students**

The admission process is transparent and inclusive and was streamlined through the use of

the ERP system. Student applications, scrutiny, merit list, etc. were all done through the ERP system thereby minimising human error. Faculty were assigned to handle PR queries pertaining to their Departments at the PR desk. Fewer faculty were required for the admission process since the process was online. The Scrutiny committee ensured that admissions followed government regulations and rules pertaining to reservation.

6.2.2 Implementation of e-governance in areas of operations:

❖ Planning and Development

The Enterprise Resource planning software enables planning and uploading of data templates like time table and classroom allocation on the intranet.

Registering of complaints pertaining to plumbing, electricity, computers etc can be recorded and facilities like conference halls and auditorium can be booked on the intranet

❖ Administration

The ERP helps collate information, generate reports and store data essential for planning and decision making. Feedback mechanisms and grievance redressal through the online systems in place makes administration more effective.

❖ Finance and Accounts

Tally is used in preparation of budgets, maintenance and audit of various accounts. ERP helps integrate data pertaining to a student and facilitates record of fee payments and dues if any. This is integrated with online student course registration, applying for exam, payment of fees etc.

❖ Student Admission and Support

ERP starts recording all data pertaining to a student from the time a student officially enrolls after payment of fees and culminates when a student takes a transfer certificate. Applications are available online and students receive admission notice and other details online. Fee payments can be made by NEFT transfer or by card or cash at the bank extension counter. Course registrations and applying for exams is done online.

❖ Examination

The Examination process has been automated. ERP supports online application for examinations, payment of course and exam fees and recording of CIA marks. Students can access and download their hall tickets online. Generation of seating arrangement of students for exams, allocation of invigilation duties for faculty and exam duty for non-teaching staff is also facilitated.

1.Upcycling of wood

Upcycling is a unique practice at Women’s Christian College where salvaged timber from fallen trees and steel from renovated buildings on campus is used to furnish academic, administrative and residential blocks on campus. Upcycling reduces the amount of waste generated on campus while finding creative reuse, reducing costs and consumption of new materials. This initiative has resulted in around 260 pieces of furniture/ aesthetic utility items for use in College. This environment friendly, sustainable practice has also reduced expenditure on furniture.

2. Streaming of general English course to enable the course to be more student specific

The Department of English offers a unique, level based foundation English course for learners with varying proficiency levels. This course is a shift from a content based approach to a skill based approach to equip students with skills for effective communication and employment. This course takes into consideration the different proficiency levels of students and provides outcome based training. Learners are divided into different proficiency levels based on diagnostic tests and a syllabus is framed for every semester in each level using an activity based framework. The course is designed such that the four skills necessary for language learning namely listening, speaking, reading and writing are incorporated into the curriculum. This is offered as a four level English for Communication course. This program has successfully bridged the gap between requirements and outcomes and has also been introduced for Shift II this year

3. Seed grant for research

The Women’s Christian College Management introduced a seed grant for student research to give impetus to research and create a research culture on campus. Since its inception in 2015-16 , 76 undergraduate and post graduate students have taken up research and presented their research findings to the College community. Many have presented papers at seminars/conferences and published in journals. More undergraduate students have been motivated to take up research project s after listening to the presentations of awardees of the seed grant. A seed grant of Rs.100,000 for faculty research was introduced last year with four faculty receiving the grant. This grant will encourage faculty, especially from undergraduate departments with limited scope of research to take

up active research culminating in paper presentations or publications

4. Value added courses

Women's Christian College has developed strategies to engage the advanced learner and also provide additional knowledge and skill development for employability through its value added courses. Need based add on certificate courses are offered to students. Service learning programs are offered for extra credits. Students take up service learning programs like, turtle conservation ,tree census , mentoring school children in mathematical concepts and volunteering at the at the Government Museum whereby they apply knowledge and concepts learnt in a practical setting thereby enhancing the learning. Learner designed courses are offered for advanced learners who choose an area of specialization of their interest, related to their core domain. They develop their own content for the course. This is a self-study program facilitated by a faculty mentor. Many of these useful programs have been promoted and sustained.
