- ◆ Potato plant variety FL-2027 (commercial name FC-5) was registered by PepsiCo India Holding in India and the registration granted in February 2016, was valid until January 2031 under the Protection of Plant Varieties and Farmers' Rights (PPV&FR) Act, 2001.
- ◆ Protection of Plant Varieties and Farmers' Rights Authority (PPV&FRA) has revoked a plant variety protection (PVP) certificate granted to PepsiCo India Holding on a potato variety (FL-2027) on multiple grounds.
- ◆ PepsiCo loses rights to special Lays variety potato in India (December 3, 2021)
