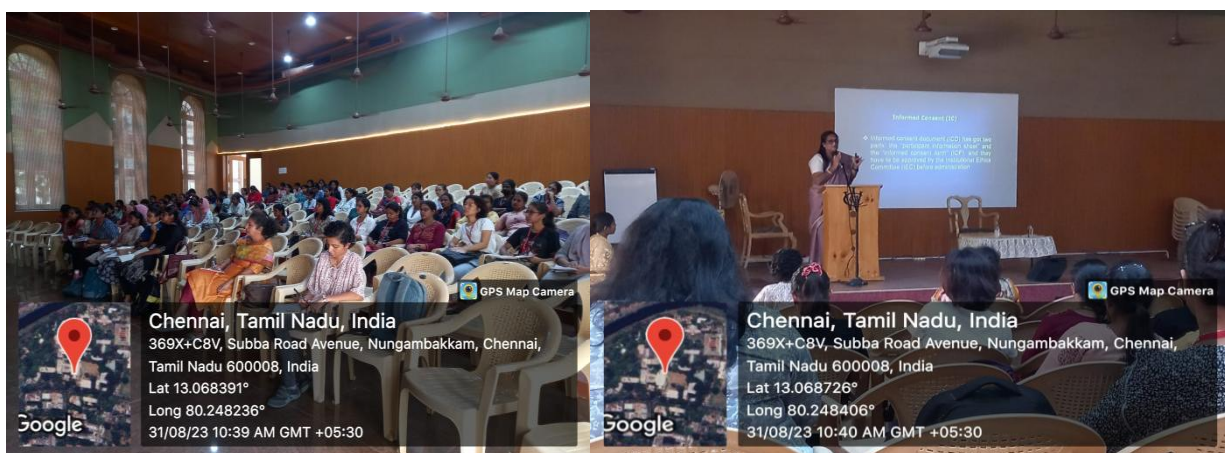
Outcome of the International Conference

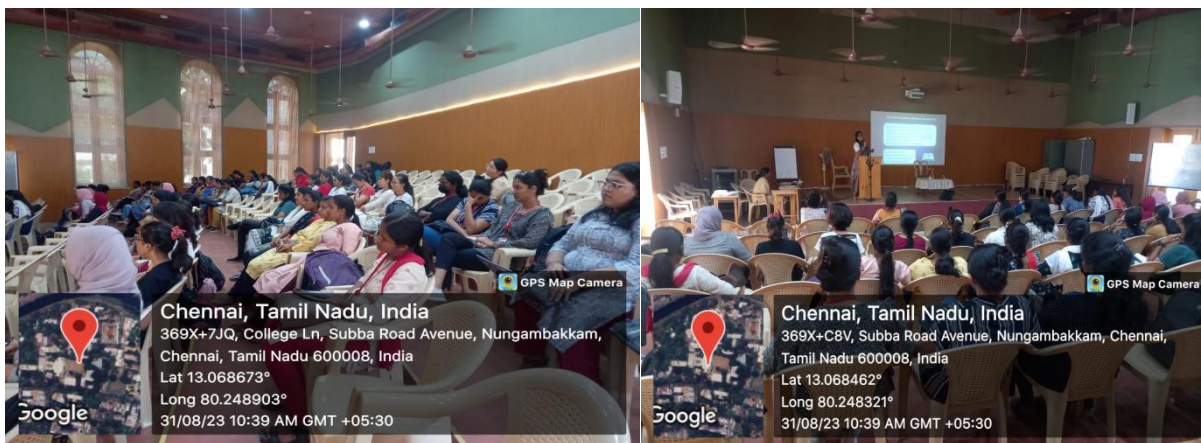

Feedback Analysis:
