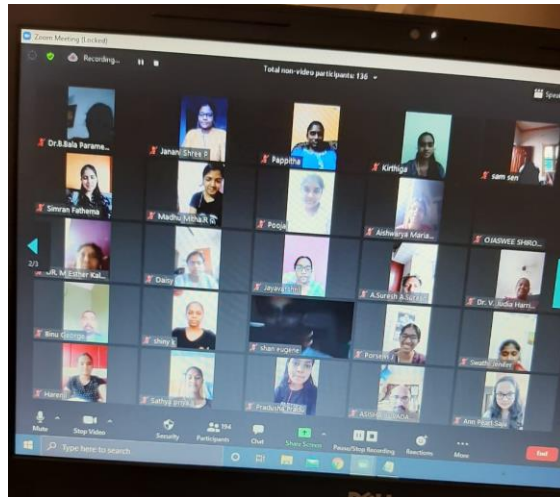

The pandemic situation around the globe has an unexpected impact on all the activities of the various organizations, institutions and industries. The unrelenting attitude of the Department was yet again proved in the beginning of the academic year. The Department moving along with the “new normal” immediately adapted to the usage of online resources and tools. The first ever Webinar was organised by the Department of History in June 2020.



A One Day National Webinar was organised by the Department on 12th June 2020, on the much relevant topic “Tourism and Travel in the New Normal”. The resource person for the Webinar was Dr. Sandeep Kulshreshtha, Director & Professor, IITTM, Gwalior. He threw light on the current state of the Tourism industry, the issues, challenges during the pandemic and the possible prospects post-covid. From hand sanitisers in hotel lobbies to cabin crew in masks, localised lockdowns to contact tracing apps, Covid-19 has transformed the world of travel. Amid closed borders and cancelled flights, travel came to a virtual standstill, with the United Nations’ World Tourism Organisation declaring 100% of global destinations had implemented travel restrictions at the peak of the pandemic. He added that The Covid-19 pandemic has brought significant challenges to the global travel industry. However, it is encouraging that by now, we have seen stabilisation or recovery of travel Activities in many of the markets where we operate. Even if the vaccine was implemented tomorrow, these changes will not all go away. There may be some relaxation in some areas, but some controls will remain in place because this is probably not the only time we’re going to have a pandemic moving forward. So, it’s a new normal.

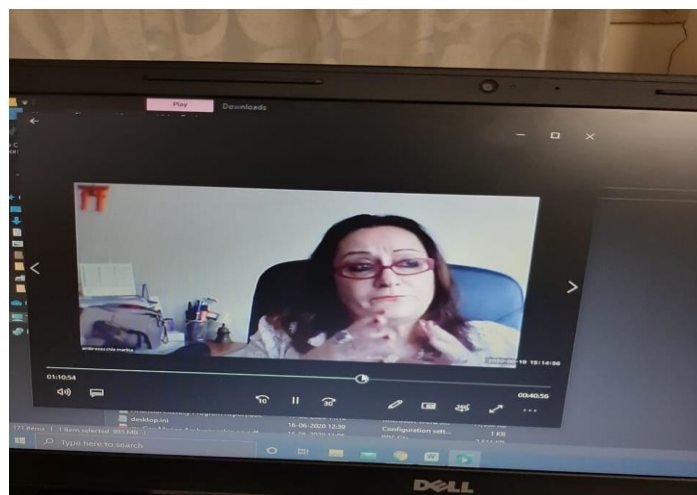

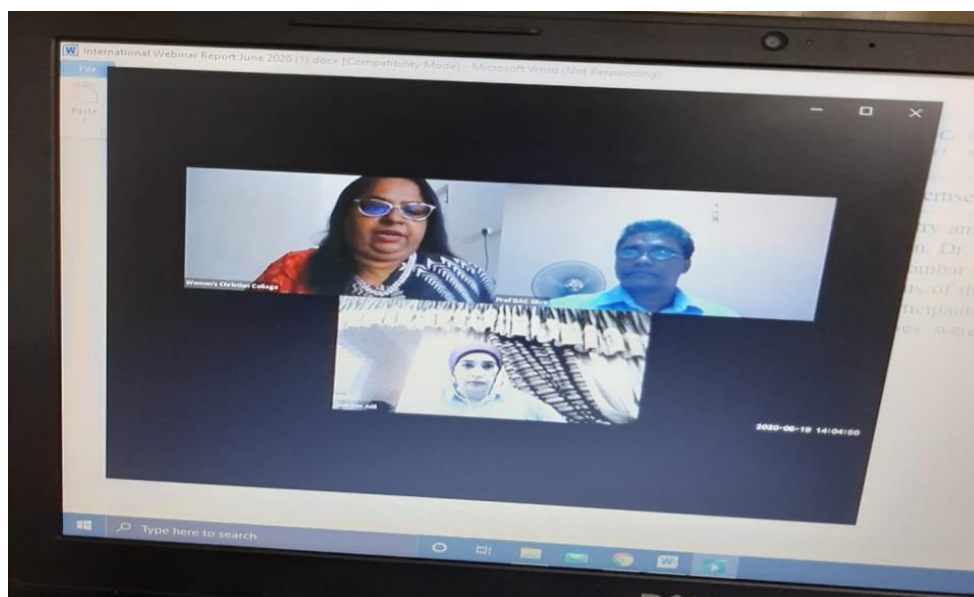

The resource persons were Dr. Enrico Panai (Expert Ethicist and Independent Researcher, Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, University of Sassari, Italy), Dr. Kevser Cinar (Senior Faculty, Member, Erbakan University, Turkey), Dr. Rubina Husain (Master Trainer & Industry Assessor, Institute of Hotel Management & Hospitality, Secretary General – Tourism & Hospitality Industry Skills Council, Bangladesh), Dr. Desmond Wee (Professor, CBS International Business School, Cologne, Germany).

Academicians, industry people as well as students from International and National spheres participated in this Webinar Series. The speakers shared their expertise on the topic connecting to the changing nature and scope of tourism and hospitality industry amid Covid 19 crisis. Day one the resource person was Dr. Enrico Panai from Italy. Speaking on the topic "The Global Economic Analysis in the New Normal", he emphasized on the trust and instability during unstable times, the Fourth revolution and the question of artificial intelligence.

The resource person for Day two was Dr. Kevser Cinar from Turkey. 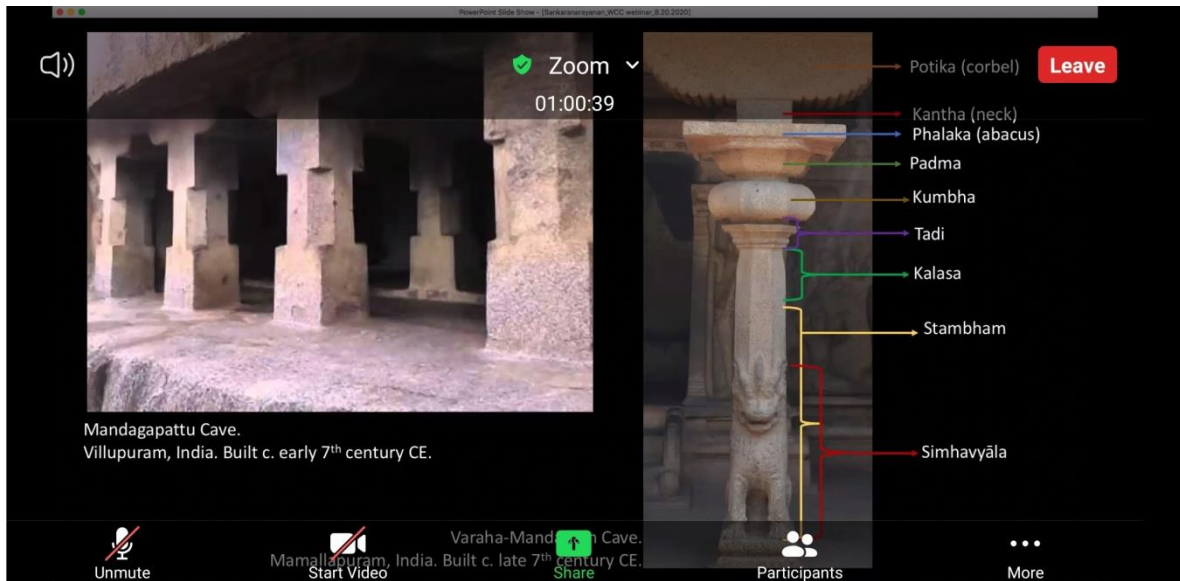
INTERNATIONAL WEBINAR ON “MIRRORING THE OTHER: BUDDHIST ELEMENTS IN THE ROCK CUT CAVES OF MAMALLAPURAM” – 20/08/2020

The Department of History organised a one day International Webinar on 20/02/2020 on the topic “Mirroring the Other: Buddhist Elements in the Rock Cut Caves of Mamallapuram”. The resource person for the Webinar was Ms. Shristi Shankaranarayanan, a researcher at University of Michigan, USA. Ms. Shristi hails from Chennai and completed her UG in a reputed college in Chennai. Her specialization is archaeology and art history.

Shristi started off the Webinar by giving an outline of the history of Pallavas and the basics of Indian Temple architecture. She showcased the types of temple architecture prevalent in India through her talk accompanied by the presentation.



She explained the various elements in Dravidian architecture starting from the rock-cut architecture. She highlighted the different styles of architecture of the Pallavas, namely the Mahendra style, Mamalla style, Rajasimha style and Aparajita style.

She then went on to compare and contrast the architectural elements of the Hindu and Buddhist edifices. The composition of the pillars in both were compared to understand the difference as well as the uniformity. She used the Chalukyan architecture as the benchmark to explain the influence of Buddhism and Buddhist architecture on the architecture of the Pallavas.

She gave ample examples of the monuments at Mamallapuram to substantiate her perspective and findings. Architectural elements like the pillars, façade, arches, kudos, lion/yali based pillars, apsidal vimanas as well as certain iconographic features were described by the resource person.

This webinar was very useful for the students as they were able to understand not only Indian architectural development but also the socio-cultural and cross-cultural conditions of the period.

**GUEST LECTURE BY DR.MERCY PAKIAM, ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, DEPT.
OF HISTORY, LADY DOAK COLLEGE ON “WHAT TO STUDY AFTER B.A.
HISTORY” - 23/01/2021**

The Department of History organised a Guest Lecture for the final year students of the Department on the topic “What to Study after B.A. History”, on 23rd January 2021. The resource person for the Guest Lecture was Dr. Mercy Pakiam, Associate Professor, Department of History, Lady Doak College, Madurai.

It was a much needed and relevant topic to be highlighted for the final year students as they are usually in a dilemma as to what path to thread on after they complete their UG. Dr. Mercy Pakiam threw light on the various fields in which there is immense scope for History graduates such as Archeology & Archives, Civil services, Journalism, Museums, Preservation, Research, Restoration and Surveys.

Dr. Mercy gave real life examples to substantiate her views and suggestions. She spoke about how the students can move into the various available prospects and fields. She also highlighted the most suitable and reputed institutions which offer higher studies so that it will be useful for the students who have planned to continue higher education after their graduation. Her talk gave clarity to the uncertain students as she touched up on the scope in cross stream employment opportunities. She also pointed out that jobs involving management can also undertaken by History graduates.

Her talk was followed by the session with the passed out students who have taken up higher education as well as landed in corporate life through campus recruitment. The passed out students who are currently pursuing Higher studies gave lot of information about their current institutions, their campus, qualification and selection procedures. The other students spoke of how they got recruited through the College Placement Cell. They gave a clear image about the interview process and how they tackled the difficult questions using the industry, management and subject knowledge they have acquired as a student of the Department. This Guest Lecture session was very much fruitful for the students to decide on their career path.

GUEST LECTURE SERIES BY DR.JAYANTHI RICHARDS, FORMER ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY, WCC ON “HISTORY OF JAPAN – AN OUTLINE” – 9/2/2021 & 22/2/2021

The Department of History organised a two day Guest Lecture Series on 9/2/2021 & 22/2/2021 on the topic “History of Japan – An Outline”. The resource person for the guest lecture series was Dr. Jayanthi Richards, Assistant Professor (retd), Department of History, Women’s Christian College, Chennai.

Dr.Jayanthi Richards who has a rich teaching experience and subject expertise especially in History of Japan gave a vivid narration of Japanese history from the Meiji period till the Second World War. She traced the political and social structure of Japan from the Shogunate era and explained the manner in which the Meiji (Emperor) was restored which resulted in the journey of Japan as an Imperial power.



On the first session held on 9/02/2021, Dr.Jayanthi Richards describe the important events in Japanese history starting from the Meiji restoration such as the Anglo-Japanese Alliance, the Russo-Japanese War and Japan’s role in the First World War. She explained in detail the impact of all these events not only on Japan but on the Far East, especially China, Korea and Manchuria. The conflict between Japan, Germany and Russia was dealt in detail. She also highlighted the imperialistic nature of Japan’s control in Korea and Manchuria – the Liangtung Peninsula.

The second session held on 22/02/2021 completely concentrated on Japan’s full-fledged growth and rise as an imperial power in the Far East and the Pacific. Japan’s complete and forceful entry into Manchuria, the Manchurian Crisis, the Second Sin-Japanese war and the circumstances which led to the establishment of the Manchukuo State by Japan was explained. The rise of Japanese military, the political condition inside Japan, the economic condition and pressure was also discussed. The manner in which Japan proceeded into World War II, the importance of the Pacific War, the Tokyo trials and the takeover of the SCAP was also described. At the end of this guest lecture series the students were able to get a complete picture of Japan from 1900 till the reconstruction of Japan at the hands of the Allied occupation and the SCAP.

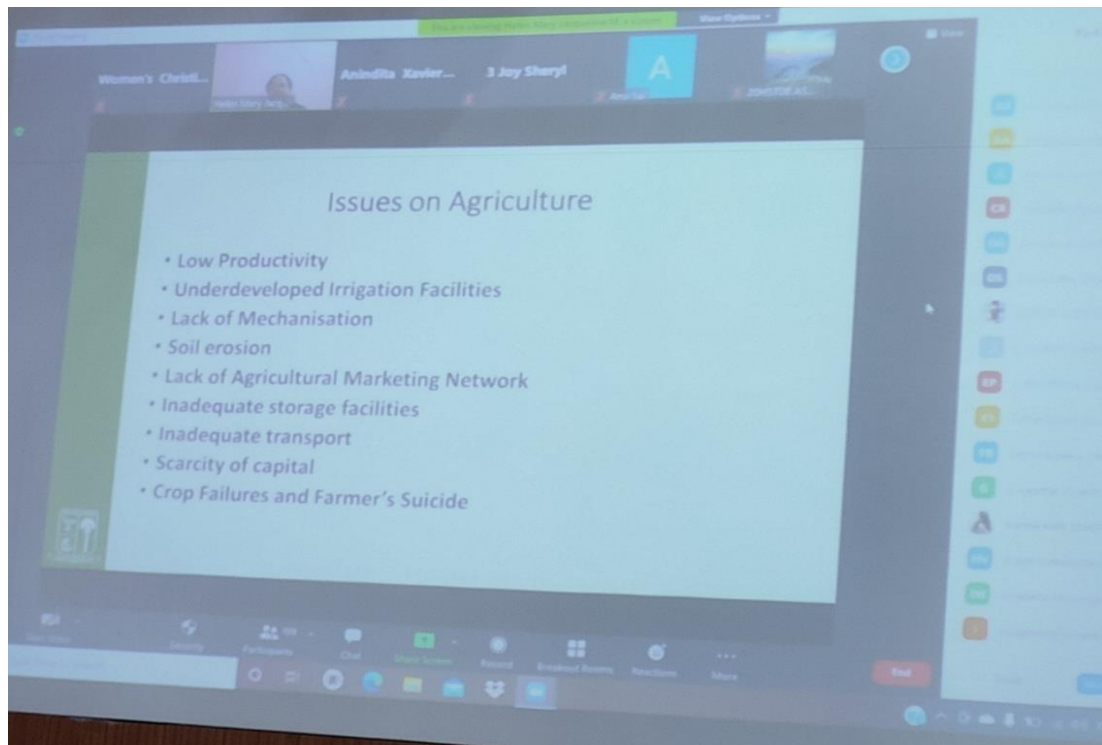

The Webinar had four sessions with Resources persons from across the country. Session I was held from 8.30 am to 10.00 am. Dr. V. Jeyaraj, Director, Hepzibah Institute of Heritage Conservation and Executive Trustee, Hepzibah Trust, Chennai spoke on the topic “Recent Archaeological Excavations in India”. His talk shed light on the important sites which were excavated by both the ASI and the State Department of Archaeology. He also touched upon the field conservation techniques of the artefacts

Dr. K. Jothi Sivagnanam, Professor & Head, Department of Economics, University of Madras spoke on the topic “Union Budget 2021-2022”. He touched upon all the aspects of the Union budget, the important concepts of economy and revenue. He explained about the assets, direct and indirect tax, liability and deficits. His talk was crystal clear, specific, enlightening yet in simple language.

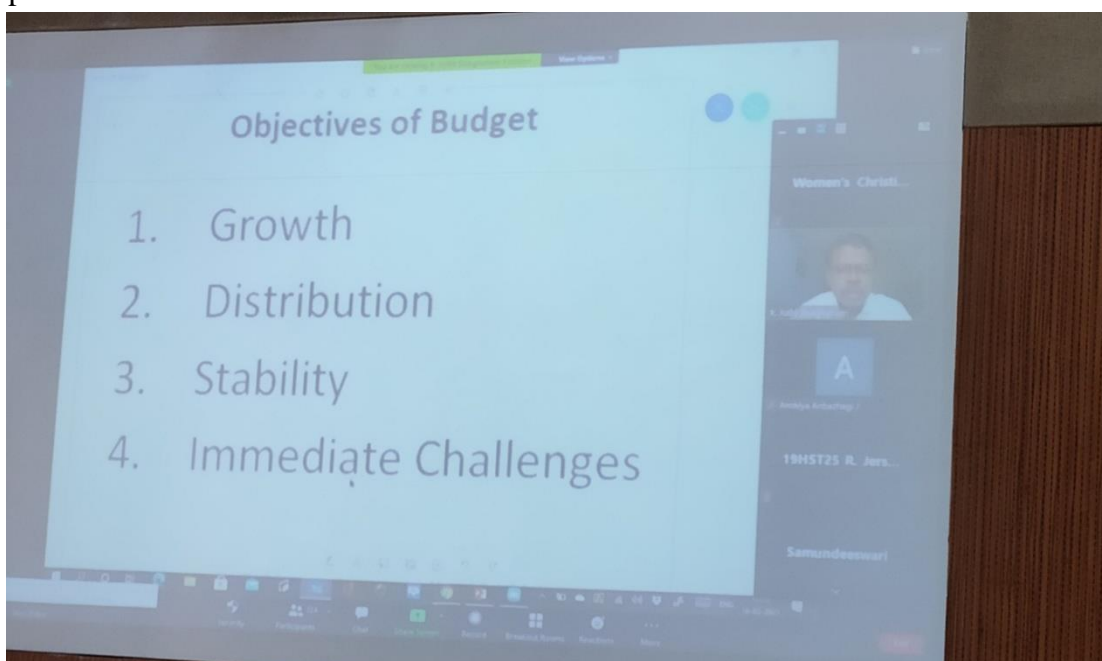

GUEST LECTURE SERIES 23/02/2021

The Department of History organised a Guest Lecture series with two sessions on 23/02/2021 where two resource persons were invited to deliver the talk. The guest lecture was organised for the Core Elective students who had opted for Principles of Tourism and Travel Management.

SESSION I - MS. PREETHI.H, ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF TTM, D.G.VAISHNAV COLLEGE, CHENNAI ON TOURISM CONVENTIONS AND ORGANISATIONS – 23/02/2021

The First session of the Guest Lecture had Ms. Preethi, Assistant Professor, Department of TTM, DG Vaishnav College as the resource person. The topic of this session was Tourism Conventions and Organisations. Since it was the first session she started her lecture by giving a brief outline of Tourism as an industry and an academic programme. Ms.Preethi laid down the definitions of certain tourism terms as framed by the World Tourism Organisation.

She explained the basic components of tourism and a brief history of tourism as well. She then went on to list down the important tourism conventions and organizations such as WTO, PATA, CAIO, Warsaw Convention, Chicago Convention, Kyoto Conventions and IATA. She explained the role of all these organizations and conventions in the growth and development of Tourism industry at the global level as well as in India. Apart from the given topic the resource person also created an awareness of responsible and sustainable tourism. Ms.Preethi also touched up on the impact of the Covid pandemic on the tourism industry. She cleared the doubts of the students regarding the scope in tourism in the current situation.

SESSION II - GUEST LECTURE BY MS. SWATHI.D, ASSISTANT PROFESSOR & HEAD IN-CHARGE, DEPARTMENT OF TTM, D.G.VAISHNAV COLLEGE, CHENNAI ON “FARE CONSTRUCTION AND SCHEDULING” – 23/02/2021

The second session by Ms.Swathi, Assistant Professor & Head in charge, Department of TTM, DG Vaishnav College, was on the topic “Fare Construction and Scheduling”.

This was a more technical topic and the resource person having a prior working experience at Akbar Academy of Airline Studies was able to do full justice to the topic. She gave a vivid and detailed introduction to Airline geography, global and national organization which control and regulate aviation and tourism.

Ms.Swathi put down the airline terms and their definitions and explained the relevance of each in travel industry. She also spoke about the freedoms of air, travel documents and formalities. She then moved on to explain the Traffic Conference Areas (TC Areas) prescribed by IATA. She then explained the global indicators such as EH, WH, Pacific and Atlantic areas based on which the airline fare is constructed. She also explained how a common scaling is framed and formulated by global agencies so that it would be easy for any travel organization across the globe to structure its fare for a said travel. The kilometers, distance and the currency is kept in mind while structuring the fare. Ms.Swathi also highlighted and decoded the City and Airport Codes given in the flight tickets after explaining the brief history behind it and the significance. The lecture ended with question and answer session wherein the students put forward their doubts in taking up jobs and higher education in the tourism and travel industry, which was clearly answered by MS.Swathi.

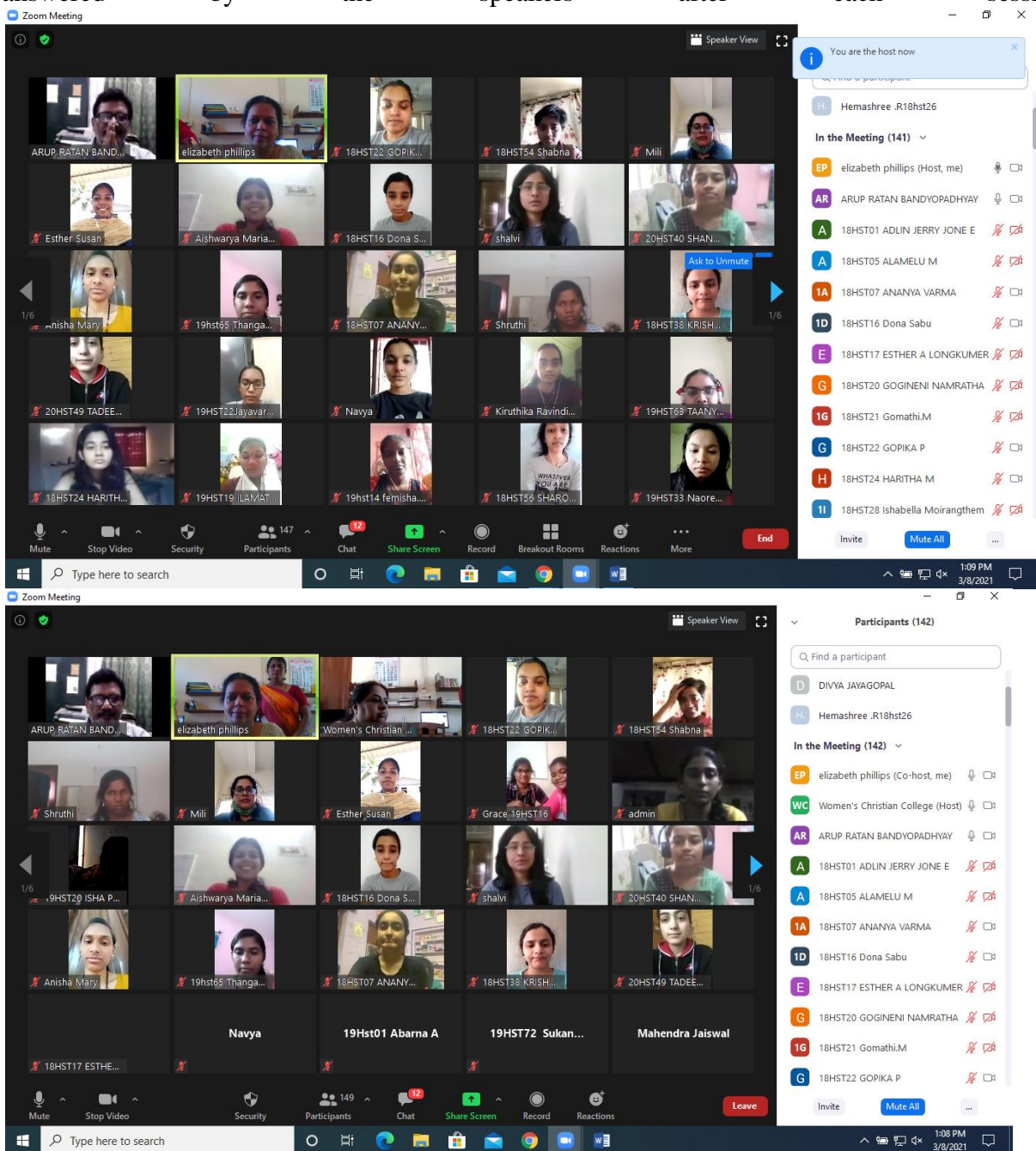

He threw light on the tribal heritage of India tracing their roots. He gave a vivid description about the various health issues

prevalent among the tribes on India. Session III was on the topic “Anthropometric Diversity”. Dr.ArupRatanBandyopadhyay captured the attention of the participants through his expertise and informative presentation. ONE DAY NATIONAL WEBINAR ON “HUMAN RIGHTS – MYTH OR REALITY?” – 17/03/2021

The Department of History, Women's Christian College, hosted a one-day state level webinar on "Human Rights - Myth or Reality". The event which spanned over three sessions, covered the various aspects pertaining to the ever-pressing issue of what Human Rights is all about. The first session which lasted for an hour (9.00 am to 10.00 am) dealt with the Various Theories and Methods of Human Rights. Dr Bernard D’Sami, Dean at the School of Human Excellence, Loyola college delivered an enlightening lecture. The importance of Genocide protection in developing

countries, the relevance of the International Criminal Court (ICC), Dictatorship and Racism, Protection of rights of children, the theories regarding Human Dignity and socio-political rights were the crucial aspects of the lecture. This session created awareness among the students regarding the importance of Human rights on an international level.

The second session, which lasted from 10.00 am to 11.00 am was taken over by Ms.Shobha Menon, Founder and Managing Trustee of the Nizhal Foundation. Ms.Shobha elucidated on the topic “Our Environment - Right or Responsibility”. The relevance of protecting the environment and how it had transformed and changed societies/communities over the years were some of the crucial points covered. Ms.Shobha’s presentation included photographs of the volunteers planting and protecting seedlings and trees. The need for sensitive treatment of trees in cities and protection of local biodiversity were emphasized. The relation between Human Rights and the Environment shedded a new light on environmental protection as well. Lastly, the students also were offered the opportunity to work with the Nizhal Foundation.

The third session began by 11.00 am, and saw the eye-opening lecture of Ms.Sherin Asha, the founder of Velicham Foundation. Ms.Asha, a champion of women’s causes, delivered her lecture relating to women and Human rights. She underlined the various aspects of women empowerment and explained how the social, educational, economic, political and psychological empowerment of women will impact the society. She also spoke about the need for the development of local opportunities for women. The students, needless to say, were inspired by the activities of Velicham Foundation and flooded the chat box with queries for the speaker.

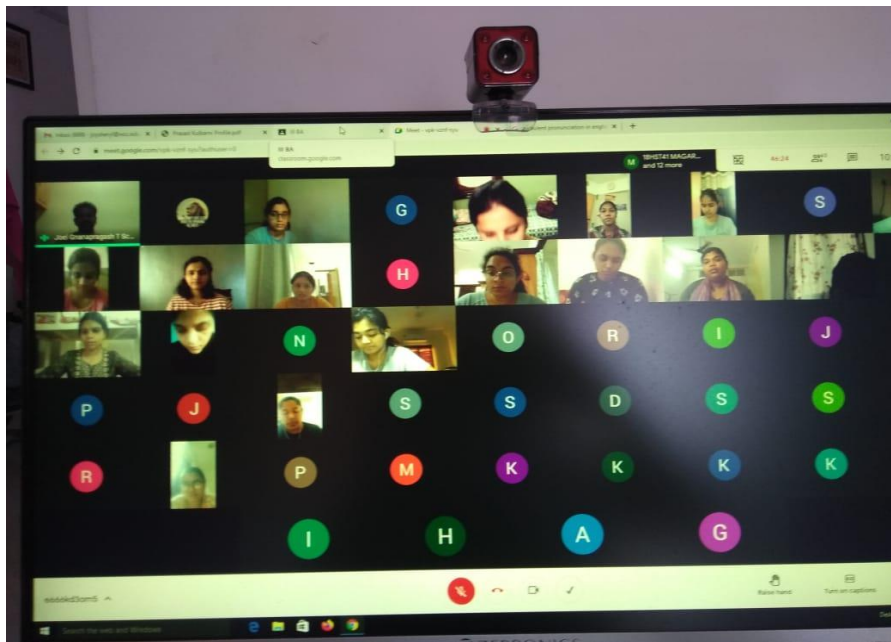

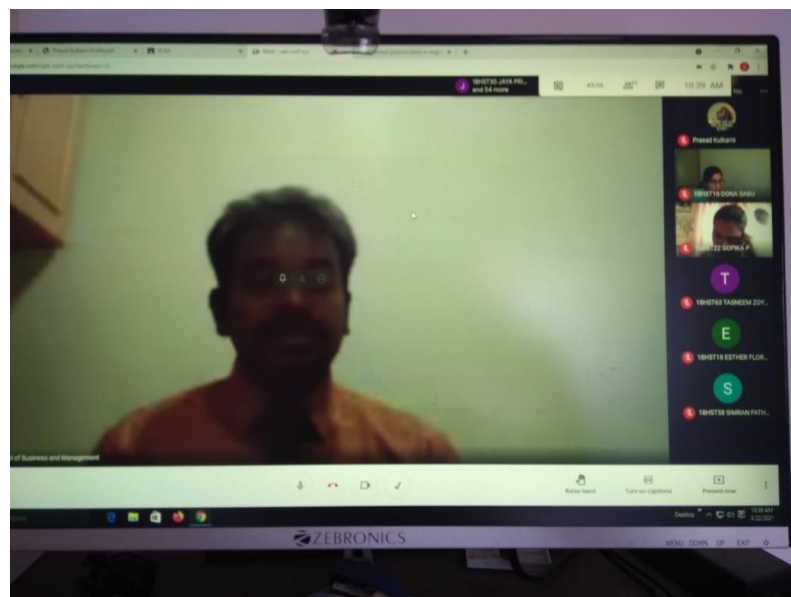
The Department of History organised a One Day Workshop on 22/03/2021 on the topic “Leadership in Industry 4.0” for the final year students. Eminent speakers were invited to be resource persons for the three sessions of the Workshop.

The first Session was on the topic “Industry 4.0 and its impact on Leadership”. The resource person for this session was Dr. Joel Gnanapragash, Associate Professor, School of Business Management, Christ (Deemed to be University).



He gave insight on how globalization has facilitated the growth of leadership in industry. He touched up the various factors which is evolving and bringing about transformation of the concept of Leadership.

Dr. Prasad Kulkarni, Associate Professor, Department of MBA, KLS Gogte Institute of Technology, Belgaum was the resource person for the second Session who spoke on the topic “Types of leaders in the context of industry 4.0”. His talk threw ample light on the unknown perspectives of leadership. Leaders differ from field to field, from industry to industry, from sector to sector. This he highlighted by explaining the dynamic qualities of leaders who belong to different fields. He emphasized the fact that a good leader should act, react and lead according to the needs of the situation and industry he/she is in.



The resource person for the third Session was Mr. Jose Martin, Administrative Officer, School of Business Management, Christ (Deemed to be University) and he spoke on the topic “Leadership in turbulent times- Agile leadership”. This session opened the students to the realistic view of today’s industrial and corporate world which is filled with crisis and obstacles all along the way. He explained the importance of leadership in crisis management. He further spoke on what kind of mindset is needed to face the turbulences in today’s situation. This Workshop proved to be very fruitful as it not only channelled the knowledge of the experts but also created a sense of realistic awareness among the students so that they can fine tune themselves to face the world.
