1. ZOOBILATE 2020

On the 14th February, 2020, the Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology opened doors for 'Zoobilate', an exhibition enlightening young minds to the world and workings of the world of zoology.

It was opened for the school students. Students from the following schools: Arputharaj Matric Higher Secondary school, Crescent Matriculation Higher secondary school, St. Joseph's Matric Higher Secondary school, Union Christian Matriculation School and Madras Christian College Higher Secondary School had participated in the exhibition and astonished at the various specimens and models on display. Teaching staff, non-teaching staff, students from other departments of WCC also attended the exhibition with much enthusiasm.

The exhibition was inaugurated by the Principal, Dr. Lilian I Jaspar. The organizing secretary of the exhibition, Dr. Benitha Golda gave a preamble of the exhibition. She entered the college as a 16 year old PUC student in 1977 and graduated from the department of Zoology in 1981. She pursued her Master's in Presidency college and her PhD in Madras Christian College. Dr Mary Pearl was instrumental in initiating a number of projects which include, the service learning program to the Egmore Museum, the field zoology course, the vermicompost project and many more. She is a very calm and collected teacher and is very patient with the students, taking her time to clear each of their doubts. She never lost her patience with any of them and is an excellent teacher. Her knowledge about birds and her dissection skills are extremely remarkable.

Dr Mary Pearl also gave a talk about environmental conservation by carpooling and waste segregation by giving the example of Sushila Sable who started off as waste picker but is now an ambassador for climate change; she achieved this feat by segregating plastic waste before selling it.
