

It was a truly enriching dawn to dusk event where the faculty members spent their day spotting and identifying birds in the city.










6. Talk on "DOCUMENTING ECOLOGICAL AND SOCIAL ASPECTS OF ARUNACHAL PRADESH" by Ms. Janaki Mohan, World Wildlife Fund (WWF)

Janaki Mohan, former student of the Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology department graduated from WCC in the year 2015. As a student she was said to be vivacious and stays engaged in the activities of the department. After graduating with Master's degree in Wildlife biology, she began her internship with the World Wildlife Fund (WWF) and later got a permanent position there. She continues to serve the local community people and shining as a steward in conservation working across Community Conserved Areas (CCAs) of Arunachal Pradesh.

On the 25<sup>th</sup> of September, Ms Janaki gave a motivating talk on the type of conservation work she does at Arunachal Pradesh. Her project was concerned with documenting ecological and social aspects in Arunachal Pradesh in Thembagin West Kameng district, home to Monpa community. She briefed on how the local communities in these CCAs have formed committees to undertake wildlife monitoring, patrolling and community based tourism activities.



As a Part of National Moth week Celebrations on campus, department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology had organized various events and competitions. The celebrations kicked off officially by an informative lecture by Dr. Mary Pearl Ravikumar, former faculty of the department. Dr. Pearl is an avid bird watcher and can identify any bird within milliseconds. Her passion towards birding and mothing had struck every faculty and student of the department in awe.

Dr. Mary Pearl exemplified the differences between moths and butterflies as the majority considers them to be the same and she aided the students in perceiving moths in a new light as highly diverse, vastly patterned, vivid with various unique characteristics. She fascinated the audience by explaining the mimicking nature of moths, their abilities of disguise etc.

She fondly remembered her memories while mothing on campus and taught the students on how to look for these vivid moths and the various techniques used to attract them for observation. Beautiful photographs captured by her had stunned the audience and gave them the intuition on the need for digital documentation. Students mentioned that this lecture was an eye-opener to the field of moth study and would surely help them in the near future.

DATE: 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2019






## **MOTH CLICKS**

A literary competition was held for all the departments of WCC where students were asked to submit a Haiku (2 lined poem) on moths. Students from both shift I and shift II enthusiastically


