



- → Tamil has obtained classical status. It's one of the first languages to attain this status.
- → Today, Tamil is spoken not only in Tamil Nadu but also in northern Sri Lanka, Singapore, Malaysia, Mauritius, South Africa, and Fiji. 1% of the world's population is Tamil speaking people, and it is the 15th most spoken language in the world.



- Tamil has been bestowed with official language status in quite a few countries, and it is one of the most widely spoken languages in the world.
- ♣ There are 6809 languages available in the world. 700 languages you can write and speak, 100+ languages own alphabet. 6 of them are basic languages. Tamil, Hebrew, old Greek, Latin, Sanskrit, and Chinese. But today only Tamil, Chinese, and Hebrew are still spoken and written officially.
- Researcher Alex Said "The First Language Known To The Humans was Tamil, spoken widely in the southern parts of the Indian states like Tamilnadu, Kerala, Karnataka, AndhraPradesh, and Telangana."
- ♣ Nearly a Quater of the Tamil speaking people do not know how to read or write. But still Tamil is one of the longest surviving languages in The World.
- ♣ She gave such an informative information about Tamil on this World's Language Day'22.




- ♣ The event began with a heartfelt prayer by Ms. Chitra Inbanathan, Librarian, and President of the NDLI club.






