Educational Trip to IISER, Trivandrum

The Department of Physics organized an educational study tour for the III B.Sc. Physics students to the Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER), Trivandrum, Kerala, from the 23rd to the 25th of August 2024. A group of 40 students participated in the tour, which was a part of their academic curriculum aimed at providing exposure to advanced scientific research and experimental techniques. The students were accompanied by Dr. Hannah Ruben and Dr. J. Juanita Saroj, faculty members from the Department of Physics. The visit began on the 23rd of August 2024, with an outreach program organized by IISER Trivandrum. The students attended a lecture by Dr. Mayanglambam Suheshkumar Singh, which provided an introduction to the research activities and academic programs at IISER.

Following the lecture, the participants were provided with refreshments, allowing the students and faculty to interact informally with the IISER staff. The group visited the research laboratories of the Department of Physics. During the visit, students were introduced to the various ongoing research projects, experimental setups, and sophisticated instruments used in cutting-edge physics research. The Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF) at IISER was another highlight of the visit. The students were given a detailed tour of the facility, which houses advanced instrumentation critical to research in physics, chemistry, and biology. These activities provided a well-rounded experience, balancing academic enrichment with cultural exposure. The study tour concluded on the 25th of August 2024, with the students and faculty returning to their home institution, enriched by the experience of visiting one of India's premier research institutes.

4. Conduct week-long bridge course for the 1st years before commencement of regular classes

Bridge course – June 2024

Bridge course in colleges is a preparatory programme designed to help students transition smoothly from one level of education to another, or to bridge gaps in knowledge and skills. The primary objective of the Bridge Course offered by the Physics Department is to ensure that all students are adequately prepared for advanced studies in physics by achieving the following goals These courses are especially useful for students who may not have the necessary background in a specific subject area and need extra preparation to succeed in more advanced coursework. The Department of Physics conducted an intense 7-day bridge course from 24th June 2024 to 2nd July 2024 for the first-year undergraduate students enrolled this academic year.

Day 1 (24.6.2024): Dr. A. Christina Nancy, Head of the Department of Physics, introduced the faculty of the department and spoke about the ethos of the department and explained the course structure of the undergraduate programme. The students felt enthusiastic and motivated after listening to the best practices and achievements of the department. Then Dr. Renuga Devi introduced the HI-PHY association to the students, highlighting its objectives and annual activities. During the session, students had the opportunity to interact with the Hi-Phy office bearers, gaining valuable insights into the club's operations and benefits. She also emphasized the importance of participating in seminars, workshops, and intercollegiate programs, encouraging students to take advantage of these opportunities for personal and professional growth. Dr. Hannah Priya conducted games and icebreaking activities for the students to help get to know each other in a better way. The informal activities paved way to break down social barriers between the students, made them feel more comfortable and facilitated social interaction.

Day 2 (25.6.2024): Dr. Sharmi Kumar began by outlining the objectives and expected outcomes of the laboratory work, providing a clear road map for the session. Basic instructions and the standard operating procedures of Physics lab were explained clearly to the new comers emphasizing critical practices and safety measures. She then explained the experiments in this semester's practical course with clarity and enthusiasm, ensuring the students grasped the essential concepts and the step-by-step procedures. She also delved into the theoretical background, connecting the experiments to the relevant scientific principles. By the end of her explanation, the students felt confident and well-prepared to conduct the experiments.

Day 3 (26.6.2024): Dr. I. Monica Chandramalar motivated the students by expressing strong belief in their unique talents and emphasized the exciting journey of discovery ahead. She assured them of the support of all the Physics faculty, encouraging open communication and collaboration. She also gave a brief introduction about the internal and external exams at WCC, evaluation pattern and the marks associated with them. Lastly, she provided practical advice for staying organized and maintaining a balanced approach in their studies.

Day 4 (27.6.2024): Dr. Renuga Devi conducted a session to introduce the fresh-year Physics students to the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) of Women's Christian College. The primary aim of the session was to highlight the importance of the IIC in the student's academic journey. Dr.

Renuga Devi explained the different types of activities organized by IIC to nurture the young minds and encouraged them to pursue innovative ideas and entrepreneurial ventures. The session concluded with a strong encouragement for all students to get involved with the IIC. The session was well-received by the students, who expressed a keen interest in the opportunities presented by the IIC.

A bridge course session on the topic 'oscillations' was conducted Dr. Renuga Devi. The session aimed to bridge the gap between high school knowledge and college-level understanding, ensuring a smooth academic transition. The Key topics covered includes motions and oscillations, types of oscillations and the key parameters. The nature of Simple Harmonic motion and measurement of time period of oscillation was explained by the demonstration of simple pendulum experiment.

Day 5 (28.6.2024): Ms. Lynn, an accomplished alumna from the Department of Physics, currently pursuing her PhD in the Department of Medical Physics, Anna University, delivered a motivational talk that inspired and energized the students. As a distinguished guest speaker, she shared her personal story of overcoming challenges and persevering in her academic and professional journey. She emphasized the value of learning from failures and provided practical advice and tips on how to stay motivated and focused on their goals. Finally, she shared stories of role models or mentors who inspired her, demonstrating the impact of positive influence.

Christina Nancy thoroughly explained the lab experiments to the first-year students, starting with the objectives and expected outcomes to ensure clarity. She provided essential background information of the experiments, emphasizing the theory behind the experiment. She then demonstrated the experiments and taught the importance of careful observation. She also encouraged questions to foster an environment of curiosity and understanding. Finally, the students were allowed to explore the basic instruments such as vernier callipers and screw gauge under her guidance and the students were highly thrilled to learn the usage of the instruments.

Day 6 (1.7.2024): Dr. A. Christina Nancy took the students to the carpentry workshop, where she began by explaining the importance of woodworking skills and their practical applications. She introduced the basic tools and equipment used in the workshop, demonstrating their proper use and emphasizing safety protocols. All the workshop machineries were introduced to the students and the lab experiments were taught with hands-on training.







Day 7 (2.7.2024):

Dr. Kalavathy Shanthi, retired Professor and the Head of the department of Physics, WCC gave a guest lecture on the theory of errors, starting with the fundamental concepts of precision and accuracy in measurements. She detailed the different types of errors, including systematic errors, which are consistent and predictable, and random errors, which occur unpredictably. She demonstrated various methods for error analysis and emphasized the importance of understanding and minimizing errors to ensure the reliability of experimental results. Her explanation provided students with a solid foundation in error theory, essential for scientific research and data interpretation. She also explained that in physics experiments, rounding off of numbers is crucial to simplify complex data and ensure precise calculations. She demonstrated how rounding off of numbers affects the outcome of calculations.





Dr. Hannah Priya, the course teacher for Environmental studies course, gave an introduction about the subject and instilled environmental and civic responsibility in the young minds. She also how studying this course will enable them to understand, analyze, and solve environmental problems using scientific methods and ethical principles. The continuous internal assessment pattern and the type of assessment for this course was also explained.

Outcome:

All the sessions concluded with Q&A segments, where students were encouraged to ask questions and clarify their doubts. The hands-on demonstrations and real-life examples provided during the bridge course helped students gain a clear and practical understanding of the basic of college level physics by filling in knowledge gaps. Overall, the 7-days bridge course created a smoother transition for the new comers into college, and helped them become more confident and better prepared for their course of study.


6. Conduct Special lectures, Workshop, Summer Internship for school students and Faculty Development Program

Professor Subramanian Ananathanaryanan, Centre for High Energy Physics, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore was the resource speaker.

A guest lecture on 'Physics of Nanomaterials'

The events of the HI-PHY Association were inaugurated for the academic year 2024-2025 on 10 July 2024 with a guest lecture on 'Physics of Nanomaterials' by Prof. M. Arivanandhan in the Main Auditorium. It began with a prayer song rendered by the Physics Department Choir. Dr. Christina Nancy, Head of the Department, delivered the welcome address.





Dr. T. S. Renuga Devi, Faculty Coordinator for HI-Phy, introduced the speaker, Dr. M. Arivanandhan, who is a Professor at the Centre for Nanoscience and Technology and an Adjunct Professor at the Centre for Energy Storage Technologies at Anna University, Chennai. With over 22 years of research experience, his expertise spans the physics of crystals, photovoltaics, thermoelectrics of bulk and nanomaterials, crystal growth under microgravity, and defect engineering in Si and SiGe alloy semiconductors.

Dr. M. Arivanandhan delivered a lecture on 'Physics of Nanomaterials'. He began by explaining the basics of nanoscience and nanotechnology, followed by the applications of nanomaterials, the confinement of electrons as a fundamental aspect of technology, and a size comparison between bulk and nanomaterials. His presentation offered valuable insights into the advancements in nanomaterials. Following his talk, the incoming HI-PHY Office Bearers for 2024-2025 were initiated by the chief guest. ACADEMIC EVENTS

Rachel Philip Endowment Workshop: July 1, 2021

The Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology organized an online workshop titled "Application of Data Analytics in Zoology Research using SPSS" on July 1, 2021, from 9.00 am to 1.30 pm. This event is held annually in memory of Ms. Rachel Philip. For the academic year 2021-22, Dr. N. Vishwanathan, Associate Professor in Statistics at Presidency College, Chennai, was the resource person. He introduced SPSS (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences), emphasizing its utility in processing complex data for market research, surveys, and data mining. The main objective of this workshop was to introduce students to statistical tools for analyzing scientific data and provide hands-on training with notable statistical tests.

National Webinar; 28 August 2021

The Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology held its first National Webinar titled "Sustainable Living - the Way Forward for Earth's Sake" on 28th August 2021, with 210 participants from various Arts and Science colleges across India. The guest speaker, Dr. Sultan Ahmed Ismail, an eminent soil biologist and ecologist, addressed critical issues regarding sustainable ecological practices.Dr. Ismail began by highlighting the detrimental effects of anthropogenic activities on the environment. The webinar was an eye-opener, underscoring the urgent need to adopt sustainable practices for the well-being of our planet. Dr. Ismail's engaging and realistic presentation left a lasting impression on participants, emphasizing that while restoring nature might be impossible, rehabilitation through sustainable practices is achievable and essential.

International Webinar: April 1st and 2nd 2022

The Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology organized a two day International Webinar on "Awareness towards Peace Education" on 1st and 2nd April 2022. The primary objective was to raise awareness among students and faculty about the importance of Peace Education. The event saw participation from 329 individuals from various Arts and Science colleges in India and four international delegates.

On the first day,the Inaugural Address was delivered by Dr. Christine Vertucci from the Mindanao Peacebuilding Institute Foundation, Philippines, emphasizing the crucial role of the academic community

in promoting peace. The keynote speaker, Dr. Angela Wai Ching Wong, stressed the impact of inner peace on broader society.

The first lecture session featured Jonathan E. Rudy discussing "Deep Connections: Why Peace Education's Time Has Come," followed by Maria Ida Giguiento on "My Philosophy of Peace Education." A Q&A session concluded the day, with participants engaging actively with the speakers. On the second day, the third lecture by Rev. John Prasad addressed the "Challenges in Designing a Curriculum for Peace Studies." Ms. Jenee Peter shared her personal experiences in establishing the Centre for Peace Studies and Dialogue, and Dr. V. Judia Harriet Sumathy discussed the "Role of Science in Peace Education." An interactive Q&A session followed.

Alumna Talk: June 3rd 2022

On June 3rd, 2022, Dr. Shomita Steiner, an alumna of the Department of Zoology (1995-1998) and Associate Director for Laboratory Operations at the Indiana Center for Regenerative Medicine and Engineering, Indiana University, delivered a lecture on biofilms and their role in wound healing. She highlighted two treatment methods: Traditional and Emergent, with a focus on Electroceuticals, specifically Wireless Electroceutical Dressing (WED), which uses silver and zinc to generate an electric field to prevent biofilm formation. Future directions include DNA-protein inhibitors, Next-gen electroceuticals, and biomarkers of biofilm infections. The lecture provided valuable insights to the 106 students and 12 faculty members who attended.

CO-CURRICULAR EVENTS

Moth week Celebrations: July 19th to 23rd, 2021

National Moth Week (NMW) is a global citizen science initiative to study and document moth populations, celebrating their diversity, life cycles, and habitats. Held annually during the last full week of July, NMW encourages participation from both scientists and the public in night-time moth surveys, contributing valuable data to online biological databases. The Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology has actively participated in NMW since 2014. For 2021, the department's Bioimage Club scheduled various events from July 19 to 23. Dr. Betsy Selvakumar, former Vice-Principal of Women's Christian College and HOD of the Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology Department, presented "The Moth Talk." Dr. Betsy

Selvakumar took the audience on a virtual journey through the history of the department's involvement in NMW, starting from a dry run in 2013 to their first night mothing event in 2014, where they documented 19 species. Despite the lockdown, the department continued virtual events, such as Moth Art, Moth Haiku, and Moth Clicks.

Awareness on PCOS: September 30, 2021

Combat PCOS Inside and Out" was an enlightening talk organized by the Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology on September 30th, 2021, via Zoom for final-year students. The guest speaker, Dr. Samundi Shankari, founder and Chief Consultant of Srishti Fertility Centre, provided an overview of Polycystic Ovary Syndrome (PCOS), its causes, symptoms, and management. Dr. Samundi Shankari emphasized the benefits of yoga and dietary changes, such as consuming complex carbohydrates and anti-inflammatory foods, to manage PCOS. Treatment focuses on regulating menstrual cycles, managing symptoms like hirsutism and acne, and addressing insulin resistance.

Challenges Faced by Budding Entrepreneurs August 23, 2021

The BioImage Club of the Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology, in collaboration with the Institution Innovation Cell (IIC), organized a webinar on "Challenges Faced by Budding Entrepreneurs" on August 23, 2021. The event, part of the Entrepreneurs Week Celebration, was attended by 67 students and 9 faculty members. The session began with a prayer by Dr. Annie Rubens, followed by an introduction by Dr. Judia Harriet on IIC and the Entrepreneur Cell. Speakers Ms. Anne Aparna, Ms. Pavithra, Ms. Rachel Jennifer, and Ms. Sreeja shared their entrepreneurial journey and the challenges they faced. They discussed brainstorming, resource management, marketing, capital, and human resources. They emphasized practical thinking, teamwork, communication, and time management as crucial elements for success. Their start-up, "Wildly Pure," produces eco-friendly, chemical-free cosmetics. They highlighted their commitment to nature and reducing chemical impacts on health and the environment.

Invited Talk by a Budding Entrepreneur April 05, 2022

The Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology, in association with the Institution Innovation Cell (IIC) of Women's Christian College, organized a special talk on April 5, 2022. The event aimed to motivate students to develop their entrepreneurial skills and turn their interests into budding businesses. The speaker, Ms. Gayathri Ranjan, an alumna and founder of The Sweet Saints, shared her journey of starting a small-scale home business. She discussed the challenges encountered and strategies adopted to overcome them. About 110 participants attended, including 13 from the Department of Home Science.

Celebrating 100 Years of the Department of AZBT

Release of a Field Guide to the Moths of WCC: 3rd August, 2022

The Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology at Women's Christian College launched "Moths of Women's Christian College-A Field Guide" during its centenary celebration on the 3rd of August, 2022. The Principal of Women's Christian College, Dr. Lilian I Jasper welcomed the gathering and fondly recollected the mothing adventures of the Department over the years. Dr. Vanitha Williams, Head of the Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology, presented the History of the Department since its inception in 1922 and highlighted the leadership across the decades. She further elaborated on why we chose to study moths emphasizing their beneficial aspects and adding interesting facts about them.

The Chief Guest Dr. R.W Alexander Jesudason, Pro Vice Chancellor, Hindustan Institute of Technology & Science, Chennai congratulated the department and recalled the dedication and commitment of the former faculty of the department. He encouraged interdisciplinary research. He launched the field guide, authored by six faculty members, and presented the first copy to Dr. B. Vasantharaj David, an esteemed entomologist. The book, documenting 104 moth species from 13 families, aims to introduce readers to urban moths observed on campus over eight years. Dr. David emphasized the importance of taxonomic research and commended the department's efforts.

Rachel Philip Endowment Workshop: 20th September, 2022

The Rachel Philip Endowment Workshop, held on September 20, 2022, by the Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology, featured Ms. Aganya Pari, co-founder of SACS Vanya, who discussed vermicomposting. She explained its basics, necessary materials, and how to economically prepare a worm bin using household products. Ms. Pari highlighted the red wiggler earthworm (*Eisenia foetida*) as ideal for vermicomposting due to its surface feeding, temperature tolerance, voracious appetite, and rapid reproduction. She outlined the worms' food preferences and provided detailed steps for using vermicompost for seeds, plants, indoor plants, and trees. During the hands-on training, participants prepared a vermicompost bed with leaves, soil, manure, water, and fruit waste. Ms. Pari guided them through the process, explaining large-scale vermicomposting and its benefits. She provided free compost to attendees, answered questions, and inspired students to start vermicomposting and plant more using compost.

Lecture By Faculty From Monash University: 28th September,2022

On September 28, 2022, the departments of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology and Plant Biology & Biotechnology, in collaboration with AECC Global, hosted a talk by professors from Monash University, Melbourne. The speakers were Dr. John Carroll, Foundation Dean of Biomedical Sciences, and Dr. Giuseppe Lucarelli, Lecturer and Manager of the Master of Biotechnology. Dr. Giuseppe Lucarelli's lecture focused on the principles and workings of fluorescent microscopes. He demonstrated the contrast between F-actin, nucleus, and mitochondria using laboratory images, explaining the use of fluorescent proteins and dyes such as fluorescein, and Hoechst. He detailed the process of forming images from various wavelengths emitted by cell samples. Dr. John Carroll's lecture on "Oocyte Mitochondria-Regulation of Fertility and Embryo Development" highlighted the impact of mitochondria on oocyte and embryo competency. Using research on mice, he discussed how mitochondrial dysfunction and reactive oxygen species affect fertility. He concluded with potential solutions like MitoQ and BGP-15 supplementation. Attendees included Students and faculty members from the department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology, Plant Biology and Biotechnology and the Department of HomeScience, representatives from AECC Global and Monash University.

Talk on Wealth from Waste: 28 February, 2022

The Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology, Women's Christian College, in collaboration with the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) organized a Level 1 program on "IPR and Technology Transfer" on February 28, 2023, to commemorate National Science Day. Dr. Chitralekha Ramachandran from Stella Maris College delivered a Special Talk and judged a Poster Competition on "Wealth from Waste- what nature can offer to you" The event aimed to educate students on vermicomposting and sustainable agriculture. Dr. Chitralekha Ramachandran emphasized waste management and vermicomposting's potential in turning biodegradable waste into valuable compost. The poster competition showcased innovative ideas on waste management. The session included a lecture on soil pollution, vermicomposting, and water recycling. The event fostered learning and skill development among students, promoting environmental sustainability and innovative waste management techniques.

Zoobilate '23, served as a befitting platform where the students of Class III AZBT showcased their understanding of the inspirations that the Animal kingdom offered for innovative technology and strategy, through their Posters and specimens. The class was divided into 6 teams that worked on different topics such as Biomimicry, Defence strategies in the animal kingdom, Biotic interactions, Animal Architects, Parental care in Animals, and the campus Avian diversity. Each team searched for scientific literature, researched articles from publications in reputed journals, and created posters that highlighted the interface between zoology and technology.

The event was held on the 17th of February 2023. There was an overwhelming response from 12 Government and Government aided schools. Twenty students, ten from standard 8 and 9 from each school participated.

Campus Bird Count :18 February, 2022

Women's Christian College participated in the Campus Bird Count on February 18, 2023, as part of the Great Backyard Bird Count India, supported by Cornell Lab of Ornithology and the National Audubon Society. Led by Dr. Vanitha Williams and other faculty, 27 final-year students conducted bird counting across eight sites on campus from 8:45 AM to 9:45 AM. Using sight and calls, they identified 16 bird species. The data was consolidated and uploaded to the Campus Bird Count website.

Vermicomposting on Campus: From January 2023 to February 2023

The final-year students of the department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology along with the gardeners under the supervision of Dr. Benitha Golda and Dr. Jancy Merlin are involved in the process to give them hands-on training. The students were divided into six groups of four each. Every day they took turns monitoring the temperature, Humidity, observing moisture content, and checking the process of decomposition of the vegetable wastes mixed with dried cow dung in four decomposition pits which are then fed to the earthworm (Eisenia foetida). The temperature, pH, and moisture content of the soil are regularly monitored. Once partially decomposed, the material was transferred to the vermicomposting pits. After about forty days the vermicompost produced is used as a natural fertilizer for enhancing plant growth on campus. The majority of the harvested vermicompost is used on campus as manure for the garden plants.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Rachel Philip Endowment Workshop: 24th of July 2023

The Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology organized the Rachel Philip Workshop on 24th July 2023, focusing on "Risk Management of Natural Science Collections." The workshop was led by Mr. Vinod Daniel, an internationally recognized museum specialist with three decades of experience at the Australian Museum in Sydney and the J. Paul Getty Trust in Los Angeles. The workshop aimed to provide practical solutions for addressing ten key risk factors affecting preserved specimens: disasters, fire, insects, theft, water, light, temperature, humidity, and custodial neglect. The lecture covered conservation principles and the risk factors influencing specimen preservation. Following the lecture, students observed and applied their knowledge in the museum, culminating in a brainstorming session to discuss solutions for various risks. Mr. Vinod Daniel highlighted preventive and interventive conservation methods. Preventive conservation involves proactive measures to prevent risks, while interventive conservation addresses problems after they occur. Participants were divided into four groups to develop short-, medium-, and long-term strategies for mitigating these risks. Students applied these solutions in the department's museum, enhancing their practical understanding. The workshop provided an enlightening experience, emphasizing diligent risk management as crucial for preserving natural science collections. By combining preventive and interventive approaches, participants gained insights into ensuring the long-term protection and prosperity of valuable specimens.

State Level Conference-9th of September 2023

The Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology hosted a one-day State Level Conference on "Conflict Analysis and Conflict Resolution" on September 19, 2023, sponsored by the United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia (UBCHEA). The event saw 275 participants, including 125 from various Arts and Science Colleges in Tamil Nadu and Chennai, and 150 from Women's Christian College. The conference highlighted the interdisciplinary nature of Peace and conflict studies, which includes psychology, sociology, anthropology, political science, economics, and more. The conference aimed to create awareness about the importance of Peace Education, striving towards establishing a nation characterized by peaceful coexistence.

International Conference: 10th and 11th of January 2024

The International Conference on Recent Advances in Applied Zoology was held on 10th and 11th January 2024 at Women's Christian College, Chennai. The inaugural address was delivered by Dr. Jane Prasad, Registrar of IIT Madras and an esteemed alumna, who set an intellectually charged atmosphere.Dr. Elizabeth Vinod, Associate Professor at CMC Vellore, delivered the keynote address on cell-based cartilage reconstruction. This was followed by the first scientific session chaired by Dr. S. Karutha Pandian, with Dr. Alamelu Sunderasan our distinguished Alumna, discussing the effects of lunar dust on human immunity. Dr. Bivin Thomas highlighted the ecological impact of technological advancements. The second session, chaired by Dr. P. Agastian S. Theoder, featured Dr. Karutha Pandian's discourse on anti-virulence potential against *Pseudomonas aeruginosa*. In the third session, Dr. Shital Sarah Ahaley explored

the role of ChatGPT in scientific communications. The second day included a session chaired by Dr. Priya Iyer, featuring Dr. Ninan Abraham on cytokines and airway immunity, and Dr. Asha Palat, our alumna on next-generation sequencing. Dr. Shital Ahaley chaired the final session with talks by Dr. Mohan Kumar on cancer therapy and Dr. Hena Firdaus on *Drosophila melanogaster* in disease models. The conference showcased 44 scientific papers from 20 institutions, including an international submission from Ms. Neha Srinivasan, an alumna of the department. Ten research scholars presented their papers on Day I, judged by Dr. Shital Ahaley. One of our Alumna Ms. Rohini Murugan delivered a special talk on comparative cognition. The event underscored a successful exchange of research and ideas in applied zoology and biotechnology.

Alumna Talk: 18th of December, 2023

On 18th December 2023, the Department of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology hosted a talk by Ms. Neha Srinivasan, an alumna from the 2018-2021 batch, for final-year students. Titled "Navigating New Horizons: Pursuing a Master's Degree Abroad and Exploring the World of Systematics," the session aimed to guide students on pursuing postgraduate studies abroad.Ms. Neha Srinivasan began by explaining her choice to study in the UK, highlighting the one-year duration of UK master's programs compared to two years elsewhere. She candidly discussed her experience with the GATE exam and her journey toward applying to high-ranked universities. She encouraged students to start researching universities and programs early, emphasizing the importance of comparing options and understanding application deadlines, typically close by February-March. Ms. Srinivasan shared practical advice on preparing for the visa process, managing finances, and planning for the rigorous one-year master's curriculum. She provided a visual tour of Imperial College London, showcasing its renowned facilities and Natural History Museum. In the final segment, Ms. Srinivasan discussed her assignments, including comparing Silurian and Devonian fossils, sequencing beetle mitochondrial genomes using Galaxy software, and her project on Caecilians of the Order Gymnophiona. The session concluded with an engaging Q&A, leaving students well-informed and inspired.

Campus Bird Count: 14th of February 2024

Women's Christian College participated in the Campus Bird Count on February 14, 2024, as part of the Great Backyard Bird Count India, supported by Cornell Lab of Ornithology and the National Audubon Society. Fifteen final-year students who opted for field zoology with three faculty members, conducted bird counting across eight sites on campus. Using sight and calls, they identified 23 bird species. The data was consolidated and uploaded to the Campus Bird Count website.

Moth Week Celebrations 2024

Day 1: 22nd July 2024 – Moth Awareness Campaign & Workshop

The first day of Moth Week kicked off with a Moth Awareness Campaign aimed at educating students and faculty about the ecological importance of moths. Volunteers from all three years of the BioImage Club took the initiative to place educational posters across the campus. These posters, featuring different species of moths and their roles in the ecosystem, were strategically positioned at eleven key locations, including the science block, the library, both entrances, the Mildred Allen Block, the Rivet Block, in front of CB, the psychology block, and the main auditorium foyer.

In the afternoon, the third-year students of AZBT participated in a workshop titled "Moth Memorabilia - Celebrating Moths," led by Ms. Jenisha, an AZBT alumna, mentor in the arts, and early-stage entrepreneur. Ms. Jenisha shared her inspiring journey from teaching to entrepreneurship, emphasizing the importance of passion and perseverance in achieving one's goals. She demonstrated how personal interests could be transformed into profitable ventures, encouraging students to link their passions with people's needs.

During the hands-on part of the workshop, participants created moth-themed fridge magnets using air-dry clay and paints. They learned to knead, cut, and texture the clay before painting it to resemble their desired moth models. This activity not only sparked creativity but also reinforced the lessons on entrepreneurship and artistic expression.

Day 2: 23rd July 2024 - Competitions & Flash Mob

The second day of Moth Week was packed with activities, starting with various competitions and culminating in a flash mob. Students from the department were encouraged to wear moth-themed accessories, with many showcasing their creative talents by making their own bright and colorful items.

Competitions:

1. Face Painting

Fourteen participants, grouped into pairs, transformed their partners' faces into vibrant moth-themed canvases. Each team explained their designs to the judge, Dr. Anne Beryl Catherine, highlighting the differences between moths and butterflies and emphasizing moths' ecological significance. The competition was evaluated based on creativity, adherence to the theme, and clarity of explanations.

2. Collage Making

Seven teams participated, using charts and colored papers to create collages depicting various aspects of moths, including their life cycles and habitats. The judge, Ms. Sweetlyn Moses, evaluated the collages based on creativity, thematic relevance, and overall presentation.

The President and Vice President of the BioImage Club then presented a comprehensive report on the entire Moth Week celebration, highlighting the success of the various events and the enthusiastic participation of students.

The program concluded with the distribution of certificates to the winners of the competitions, recognizing their creativity, knowledge, and dedication to raising awareness about moths.

Ms. Rachel Philip was the former Head of the Department who served the **department for 27 years.** Every year a lecture or workshop is organized to perpetuate her memory. This year the Department organized Workshop on "Drosophila: A versatile model organism in clinical and biomedical research" on 26th July 2024 from 8.00 am - 2.00 pm. The main objective of this Workshop was to enable students to have an overview of the Drosophila rearing and maintenance, observation of mutant forms and Dissection of larval brain and gut. Dr. Solomon F D Paul, Professor & Head, Faculty of Clinical Research, Professor, Human Genetics, SRIHER was the Resource person & his team of research scholars together with the organizing team of WCC compiled a lab manual encompassing a set of basic protocols compiled from standard books and resources, shared across laboratories in fly research. The Workshop began at 8.00 am with an Opening Prayer. Dr. Annie Rubens gave introduction to Rachel Philip endowment Workshop. Dr. Vanitha Williams, Head of the Department welcomed the gathering and introduced the resource person Dr. Solomon F D Paul, Professor & Head, Faculty of Clinical Research, SRIHER. The workshop provided significant insights into the Preparation of Drosophila culture medium, **Exploration** of the lifecycle, of chromosomes. types sex identification and polytene chromosome isolation of Drosophila melanogaster, Identification of various mutant forms of drosophila and witness the wing spot assay and Isolation of wing imaginal disc and a demo on larval brain/gut dissection.

3. Invited Talk - Objective of the Invited Talk on 'Options in Higher Education for Graduates in Zoology' on 16^{th} September 2024, Department of Advanced Zoology & Biotechnology in association with the Career Guidance Cell, WCC

Speaker – Ms. Neha Srinivasan (Alumna, Department of AZBT) M.Sc., Department of Life Sciences,

Imperial College, London

The event was organised in Bamford Hall from 12:30 – 2:00 pm on 16/09/2024 (Monday). The program began with a prayer song by the students of III AZBT. It was followed by a welcome address and introduction to the event by the Head of the Department Dr. Vanitha Williams. Dr. Annie Rubens introduced the resource person Ms. Neha Srinivasan who is was going to pursue her Ph.D. in Developmental Biology at University of Warwick, London. The speaker Ms. Neha Srinivasan gave a talk on options in higher education to all the 3 years of Advanced Zoology and Biotechnology. She spoke about her journey to Imperial College where she pursued her master's program. Based on inputs she got from her classmates at WCC, she was able to give an idea on the various career options available in Zoology, like from a clinical embryologist to a public health care worker, a geneticist, a biochemist, forensics researcher and also other unique jobs like ecologist/ conservationist, zookeeper, and also as a curator in a museum. She emphasised the importance of checking the syllabus of opted courses, noting the deadline for admissions into colleges, shortlisting the courses and universities preferred. She also mentioned that once accepted, the suitable documents such as the visa should be ready. She also gave valuable tips for aspiring researchers to see every failure as a learning opportunity and never to give up. Good verbal and writing skills are very essential. 4. Workshop on Aquarium keeping: Opportunities for Students & Faculty - Early-Stage Entrepreneurs organized by Department of Advanced Zoology & Biotechnology in collaboration with Intellectual Property Rights, Institution's Innovation Council.

The workshop commenced with a quote by Jacques Cousteau, a renowned oceanographer: "The sea, once it casts its spell, holds one in its net of wonder forever."
